

Starting from the central importance of memory in contemporary societies, the aim of this International Workshop is to encourage a transdisciplinary reflection on how the “presentification of the past” is never a simple re-enactment, but corresponds to the interaction between memory and cultural sensitiveness, present beliefs and needs, expectations and forecasts for the future. The past, even the recent one, is the subject of many academic debates, media narratives, political conflicts and collective mobilizations, artistic expressions, etc., while technological innovations have profoundly changed the practices of conservation and dissemination of collective memory (with particular reference to cultural digitization). The relevance and selection of events, the organization of connections and cross-references between past, present and future, as well as the importance of diversified collective imaginaries, are the keys to narrative constructions of memory that prove to be sensitive and decisive for its continuity, and its intergenerational transmission.
